Reverse-Slant Chords for Dulcimer

We all know what I call "thumb-leading" chords (the L-shape, Slant and extended slant shapes), but what about their opposites? These chords, in addition to being closer in voicing to standard piano chords (root-third-fifth), sound better and are more versatile than their well-worn cousins. Dulcimers with 1.5/8.5 frets are recommended and shorter-scale instruments are preferable. INT
